About: Prostate Cancer

Prostate cancer is the most common cancer in men.

Black men, those with a family history of the disease, men exposed to some chemicals, and veterans are at greater risk.

Men at high risk should talk to their healthcare provider about screening at age 40 or earlier, with all others starting at age 50.

Build awareness around self-exams, screenings, regular healthcare provider visits, and encouragement for others.

→ WHAT IS PROSTATE CANCER?

The prostate is a walnut-sized gland which contributes to the fluid that helps carry sperm.

Prostate cancer is a group of cells that grow abnormally.

Prostate cancer can grow differently, some grow and spread rapidly, others grow slowly.

SYMPTOMS & MORE, PROSTATE CANCER

Early-state Prostate Cancer usually has no symptoms, but check with your healthcare provider if the following applies:

- Persistent hip or back pain
- · Difficulty urinating
- Painful or burning urination
- Blood in your urine

Sample Activity: Homeschool

ACTIVITY GUIDANCE:

Adding a prostate cancer awareness activity to the homeschool learning schedule fosters health literacy, empowers early detection via self-examination education, instills lifelong habits of well-being and hygiene, and cultivates a sense of personal responsibility. By integrating this vital topic into education, students gain the knowledge and skills to prioritize their health, advocate for themselves, and contribute to a culture of proactive wellness in their families and communities.

AGES 3 - 11, FOCUS ON HYGIENE & HEALTHY HABITS:

Teach your 3 - 11 year-olds the importance of proper hygiene for their genital area. Show how to wash the area gently with mild soap and water during bath time. Talk about the importance of keeping the area clean and dry to prevent bacteria. Make sure to use age-appropriate language to explain why hygiene is essential for health. Encourage them to ask questions and reinforce good hygiene habits regularly. This activity instills lifelong habits that promote cleanliness and well-being in the testicular region.

AGES 12+, FAMILY HISTORY & RISK FACTORS:

Engage your 12+ year-old sons in a discussion about family history and risk factors related to prostate cancer. Encourage them to know family medical history and identify any relatives who've had prostate cancer. Discuss lifestyle factors such as smoking, obesity, and exposure to certain chemicals that may increase the risk. This activity promotes awareness of personal risk factors and empowers them to make informed choices for their health.

Prostate Cancer Self-Examination Activity: Encourage your 12+ to learn about prostate cancer by guiding them through a self-examination. Provide them with educational resources and demonstrate the proper technique. Discuss the importance of regular self-checks for early detection. Encourage open dialogue about any concerns or questions they may have.

This activity fosters responsibility for their health and empowers them to take proactive measures against prostate cancer.

Sample Activity: Proclamations

SAMPLE COPY

WHEREAS Prostate cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer

among men and the second leading cause of cancer-related

deaths among men in the United States;

WHEREAS More than 180,000 men will be diagnosed this year, and over

26,000 will die from the disease;

WHEREAS African American men, men with a family history of prostate

cancer, and men exposed to Agent Orange face higher risk;

WHEREAS Prostate cancer is often treatable when detected early, yet

early stages usually present no symptoms;

WHEREAS Informed men who discuss screening and treatment options

with their healthcare providers and families are more likely

to make timely, effective decisions;

WHEREAS Prostate cancer affects not only men, but also their families,

caregivers, and communities;

WHEREAS Raising awareness during Prostate Cancer Awareness Month

encourages men to learn their risk and take proactive steps

toward early detection and treatment;
